

Nadine's turnaround was so uplifting that Channel 5 commissioned an hour long follow up show last year so that everyone could watch Katy continue to mentor her along beinspiring journey in a show called Rich House, Poor House, Changed My Life: For anyone who missed them, both shows are all thankshood departed.

But it's not just Nacline whose life has changed as a result of training with Katy at The Permanent Makeup Training Academy. In fact, for the best part of 15 years, Katy has bee changing lives, one student and one week at a time.

So we thought we would have a little look at some of the other students Katy has trained and how their lives have al been transformed from where they were, to where they are now...

First is Kaley from Sussex. Before she trained in permanent makeup with Katy, she was a front-line social worker with absolutely zero beauty experience, supporting some amazing families, but after having her first child she was made for a chance and new challence.

Since then, she has now created her dream job, in her oppropriated studies, within 2000 in her own incredible clients. Kaley told Spa Elemental: 1 had 2 small children so I was really glad I did my career in social work. I did it for 7 years, but it was quite stressful at times and there were some late finishes and you couldn't really choose your hours. The children had to go to

I trained with Katy, which was amazing and then went on to

the permanent makeup for about a year. Then when I had my son, I finished social work completely and was able to carry on through my maternity leave doing permanent makeup & built up from there.

Now I've got a garden studio that I work in and can choose to work whatever hours I want. The support from Katy has been amazing, if I ever had an issue come up or needed to ask a question or anything, Katy would respond straight away. There was never a time where she want vanisable & It was really, really helpful just to know that I have got her there, should I need it?

Next is Jo, who was from Dover. Jo had her own home cook baking business that was running away with itself. She was sick of 3am starts and late finishes to get the baking and orders done and wanted more time to spend with her family Just 6 months after completing her training, here is what sh had to some.

I baked for celebrities, I baked for royalty, but it just took over nife so fneeded a change. So much goes on behind the scenes, from your time, emails, packaging, on top of baking and peopl just wanted to beat you down as low as possible on price and i could spend 5-6 hours on just 1 order meaning very low profit magnins.

months on, what I used to earn in a week baking cookles I can earn in just I day doing permanent makeup and I get time to spend with my kids. I can come home in the evening and just relax, rather than worrying about what orders I need to get started on. It's been the best decision ever:

Finally is Stacey, who after a successful career in banking became a stay at home mum for the last few years to make the most of things whilst her youngest was growing up.

She still had the passion to work and a desire to achieve, but this time it had to be on her own terms, and it had to fit around her own busy family schedule. After spotting Katy on TV one rainy Sunday evening, with her husband's full support, the bravely decided to take the plunge and enter the beauty industry.

9 Months after finishing fier training course, Stacey update us on her progress:

A make-up artist from Braunton is making a difference to ladies suffering from cancer, by offering free semi permanent makeup eyebrow treatments every

Tia Lee, started her career in Toni & Guy as a hairdresser at just 16 years old. She then went on to train in nails and makeup to give people treatments that would make them look and feel confident and beautiful.

She wanted to help people feel amazing but on a more permanent basis.

After a short break to have her beautiful daughter, Tia started her career in permanent makeup in September 2020 after completing intense training in Sussex with self-made multi-award-winning businesswoman Katy Jobbins, who has appeared on the Prime Time hit Channel 5 TV show, 'Rich House, Poor House,' who also offers many free treatments to cancer sufferers.

The 21-year-old offers permanent eyeliner, lip and eyebrow make-up including for people, such as cancer patients, who have lost hair through illness.

Tia says: "For people suffering from hair loss, having their eyebrows done is a big deal and being able to offer that makes a huge difference to their lives. Their reactions at the end of the procedure are often overwhelming and many of them have tears of happiness at the end."

With cancer affecting so many people, including Tia's close family members, Tia has seen first-hand, the pain it brings to not only the person suffering but their friends and family also. As a result, and to give back to her local community, she is offering every single cancer patient who has lost their hair, their eyebrows permanently applied by herself, a professional permanent makeup artist for free.

She states: "Once you have undergone cancer treatments, not only have you been through so much trauma, you have most likely lost your hair. This can make us feel very vulnerable, cautious and not ourselves anymore. My goal is to show you that you are brave, strong and beautiful. Just because you may have lost your hair or may look different, you are still beautiful. You are a fighter. I have reached a point in my career and life that I feel is the perfect time for me give back and really take my level of commitment of making people feel beautiful and confident to the next level. I feel very privileged that the job I do, can help give people so much confidence and feel so beautiful."

Tia offers two free appointments every month (worth up to £495) in the practice in Braunton, for people who have lost their brows due to cancer treatments.

Ann Elsdon, from the Dronfield Eye reception team, tried out microblading, a technique in which a small hand-held tool with a fine needle is used to add pigment to the skin for brows lasting up to two years.

Hayley helps clients who have little or no eyebrow hairs at all and Ann had few after over-plucking them as a teenager.

Ann also answered medical questions, had a patch test and was

given numbing cream to apply just before her next appointment. For the treatment itself, Ann's brow area was cleaned and excess hairs were removed before Hayley carefully mapped out the brows.

Once And was happy with the preparation and the copigment - 80% blonde and 20% medium brown in her Hayley worked her magic using a microbiade, creating strokers.

Ann had asked Hayley for natural-looking brows an were also made perfectly symmetrical.

Ann said: "As eyebrows frame the face, when I had on, I never felt the look was complete, so I'm so plea what Hayley has done. It was a surprise at first ofter it meally the hadron of the said of th




